## **Bay Run Update May 2015**

Due to the new Bridge being built at the corner of Timbrel Drive and CityWest link, the BayRun will not be running its traditional circuit of the bay. After much discussion it was decided as we cannot funnel 2500 people through the wooden structure on the corner – it is too slippery, too narrow and an insurance concern to all councils. So for this year only we are running an out and back loop, we will start at our traditional spot and run anti- clockwise as usual, on the Drummoyne side of the course near our water station there will be a turnaround – basically a pole in the middle of the walk way telling the runners to turn around and go back. We will also have a timing mat here so people can't fudge their running times.

It's not ideal but after many hours of deliberating whether or not to cancel or over the vent, many phone calls to councils, discussions with local running clubs we have decided that this is the best way to go, we may lose some runners due to the change in course, but compared to not holding the event or moving it past the end of the traditional running season we felt this the best outcome.

Race times to try to avoid too much congestion we will be setting off in only 2 groups
