I have received the enclosed from the Hon Prue Car MP, Minister for Education and Early Learning in response to the urgent letter I sent on your behalf.

As you will learn, Minister Car has sought advice from the Department of Education on this matter and advises that schools in the local area are experiencing declining enrolments due to changing demographic factors. The key factor given is the affordability of the local area to families with primary-aged students.

The Minister also notes that the intake area for Dobroyd Point Public School has increased over the last three years and the Department is continuing to monitor this issue.

I have sought clarification and advice from the Department of Education on this matter and I am advised of the following:

Dobroyd Point Public School is a well-supported local school and valued for its strong community connections. Schools in the local area are experiencing lower enrolments due to changing demographic factors. The prevalence of single dwelling housing and low numbers of apartments are factors impacting the affordability of the local area to families with primary-aged students.

In the last three years, the intake area for Dobroyd Point Public School has been increased. The department will continue to work closely with the school to ensure great outcomes for students.
