3. OSHC REPORT

- Friday cooking club. Easy take home recipes that can be recreated at home.
- Due to prolonged wet weather. Have had many inside games. Lots of card games.
- Outside games include handball.
- Community breakfast was a huge hit. Hopefull to do it once a term.
- Vacation care program has just been published. 3 incursions & 3 excursions. Includes bowling, laser tag, put put golf, rock climbing, wheelchair basketball.

4. PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

- COVID Cases – still relatively low – a lot of students are isolating because of family infections. teachers have been impacted by isolation requirements. We try to have a consistent teacher on a class when possible.
- Quote accepted to replace the soft fall tiles on the terraced steps with rubber soft fall. Work expected to happen in March. We expect to receive a partial refund from toilet renovation, and this will be used to fund the softfall installation.
- Asset management:

New roof on admin building - roofing work to be completed on weekends, whilst gutters to be replaced during the week.
- Stage 3 camp can go ahead. Details to be provided to Stage 3 families shortly.

- Swimming carnival was successful at Enfield Aquatic Centre. The pool was very accommodating by moving us to the indoor pool at short notice due to the heavy rain. Zone carnival went ahead and the school did well. Two students (Ashley & Luella) will compete at the district carnival at Sydney Olympic Park Aquatic Centre.
- Reverse Interviews: Thank you for the parents who participated. Feedback has been positive.
- Harmony Day – Mon 21 March- Students invited to wear orange or red clothes to school.
- ANZAC Assembly Fri 8/4 – Time TBA in next newsletter
- Stage 3 camp – Week 1 of Term 2. Is expected to go ahead with COVID safety plan in place.

- Young engineer workshops for Stage 2 & 3 students over the next two weeks.
